

Starting the Brim



To work on the brim the ipu needs to be in this position. You will work across the ipu to the far side. Weaving needs to begin on the side opposite the bow tied in the string regardless where the marker pin is located.



We will set up two maka of maka 'o'eno with one difference. We will start by going across three $k\bar{u}$ instead of two. This will cover the string better.
