Adding on the Brim

Start the next round on the brim by isolating your starting point with pins.



Weave setting up two maka of maka 'o'eno. Weave until the $k\bar{u}$ start to fan out as shown.

Open the gate like you did on Page 2 of Chapter 9.



Lay down a mau'u. This will start just like the hāunu hūnā in Chapter 9. The difference is that we are working on the under side of the leaf now.



Close the gate.

Fold the lower right end on the added mau'u to the upper right. There should be a gap of 1/2 the width of the mau'u as shown.

Roll the folded mau'u over so the underside of the leaf shows and tuck it under



Ulana. Be sure you bring forward the $k\bar{u}$ behind your add.



Pull the added mau'u to the upper right to tighten the fold against the moe.



Weave as usual until the kū start to fan out and repeat the adding procedure. Continue until you puni.
