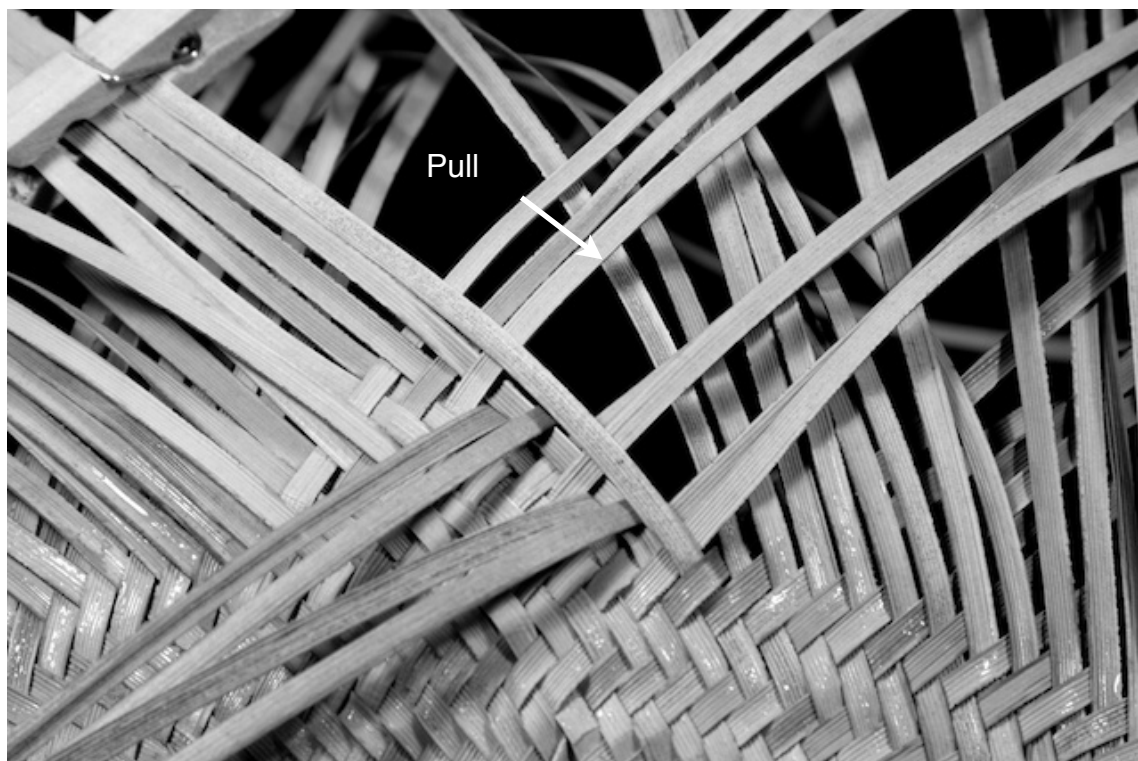


Hifi



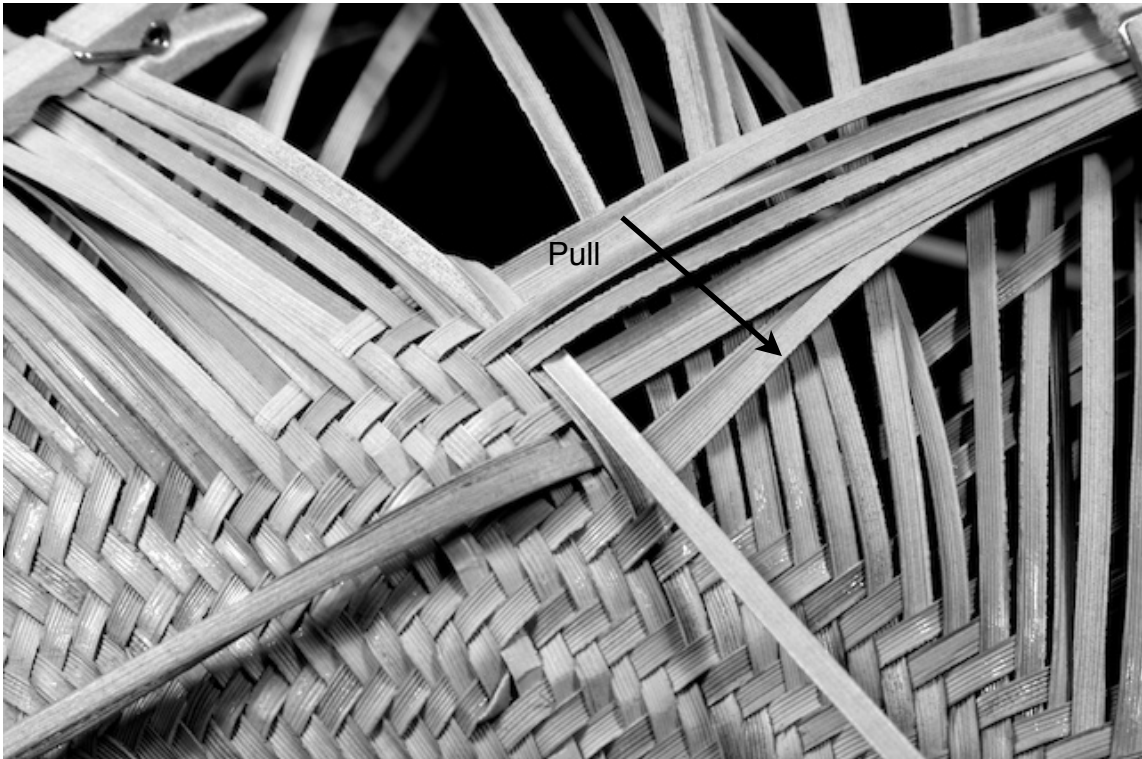
When we start the edge finish or hifi, we move the marker pin to the back of the brim (ignore all other pins which are just holding the mau'u for the pictures). That way any imperfections at closing will be in the back and not show. Set up and weave two maka of maka 'o'eno. Weave until you have three kū standing to the left of the two maka.



Moe. Pull the outside three kū hard to the right.



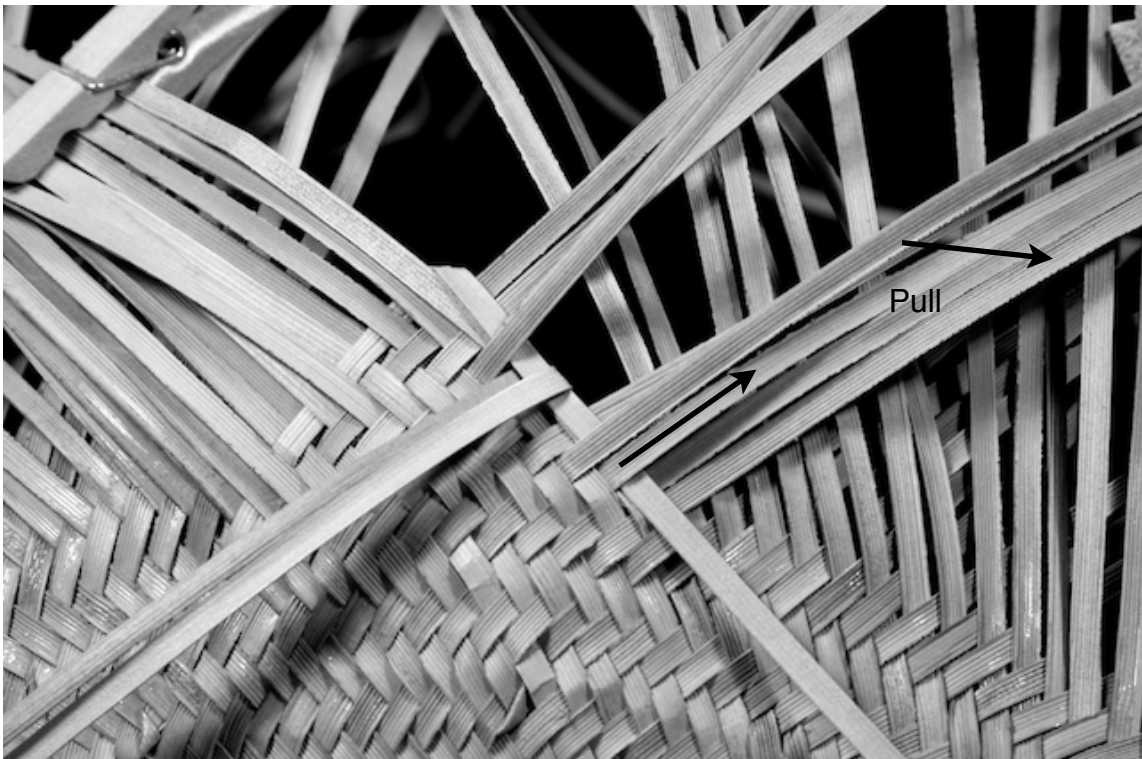
Fold the outside kū to the right and lay it on top of the moe as shown.



Bring the two kū shown to the upper right. Pull all kū near them hard to the right.



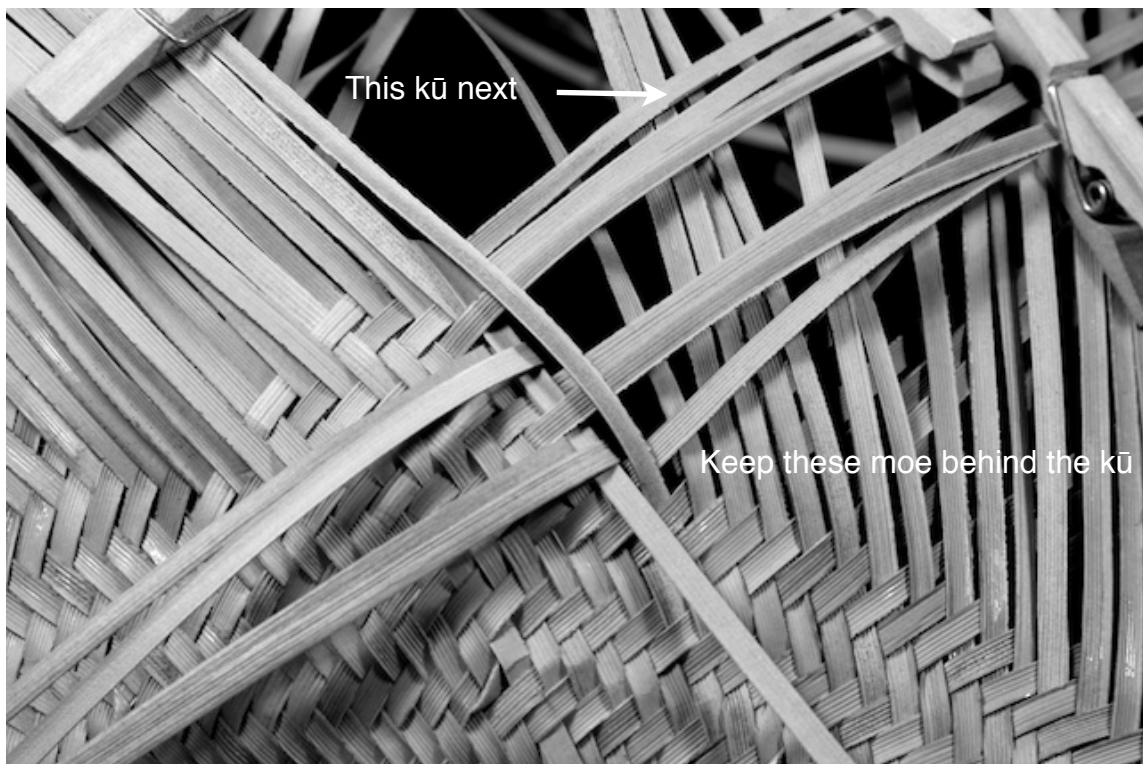
Pull the two kū shown to the lower left.



Bring up the next two kū and pull hard to the right.



Fold down the two kū shown.



Moe. Notice the we keep the moe under our working kū, bringing them up when we need them. Now repeat the process using the outside kū.



Weave until the right hand maka is incomplete because you have already woven the kū



Trim all remaining kū as shown.



Moe.



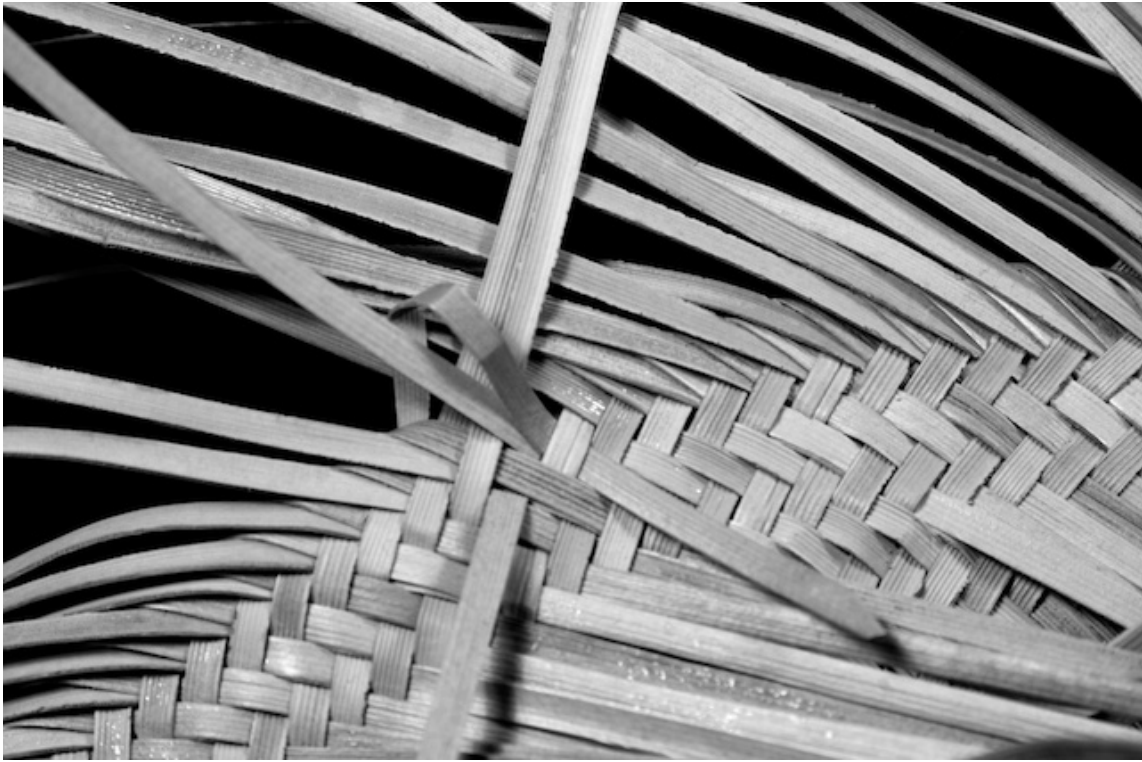
Bring across the outside kū and tuck under the next kū as shown.



Ulana.



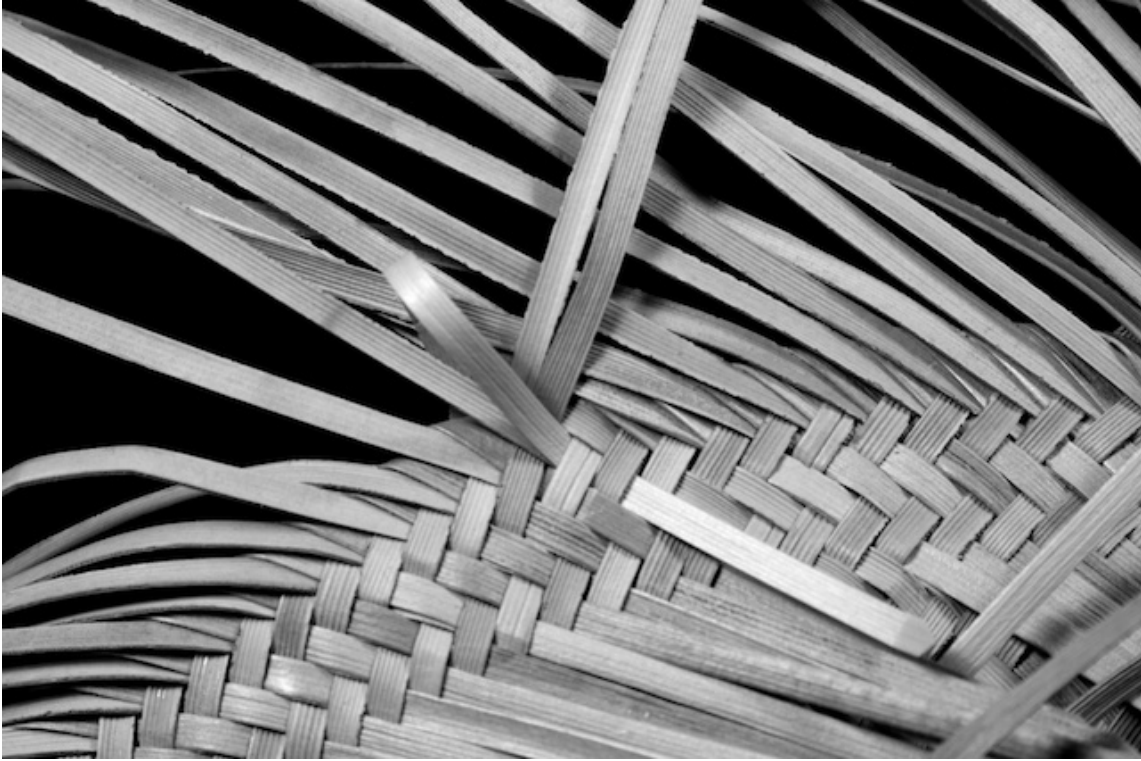
Moe and tuck the next kū under two.



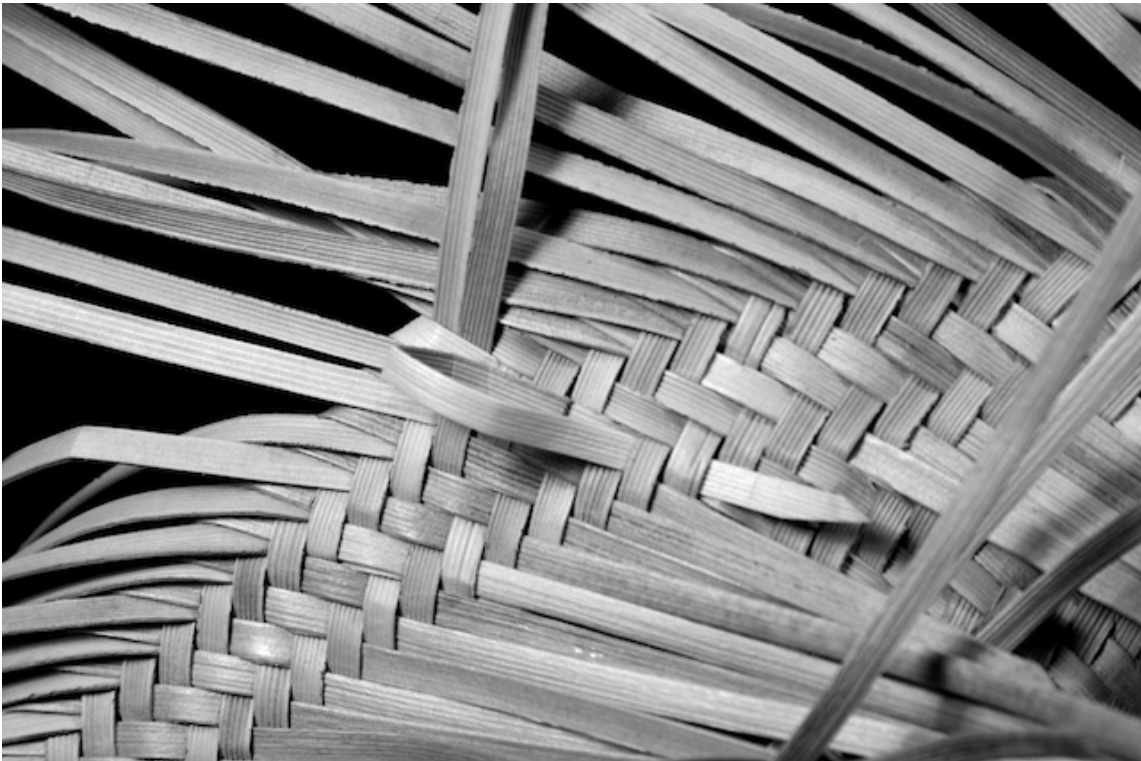
Continue weaving in a like manner until you tuck under the two sets of kū. See the next picture.



Here you tuck under the second set of kū.



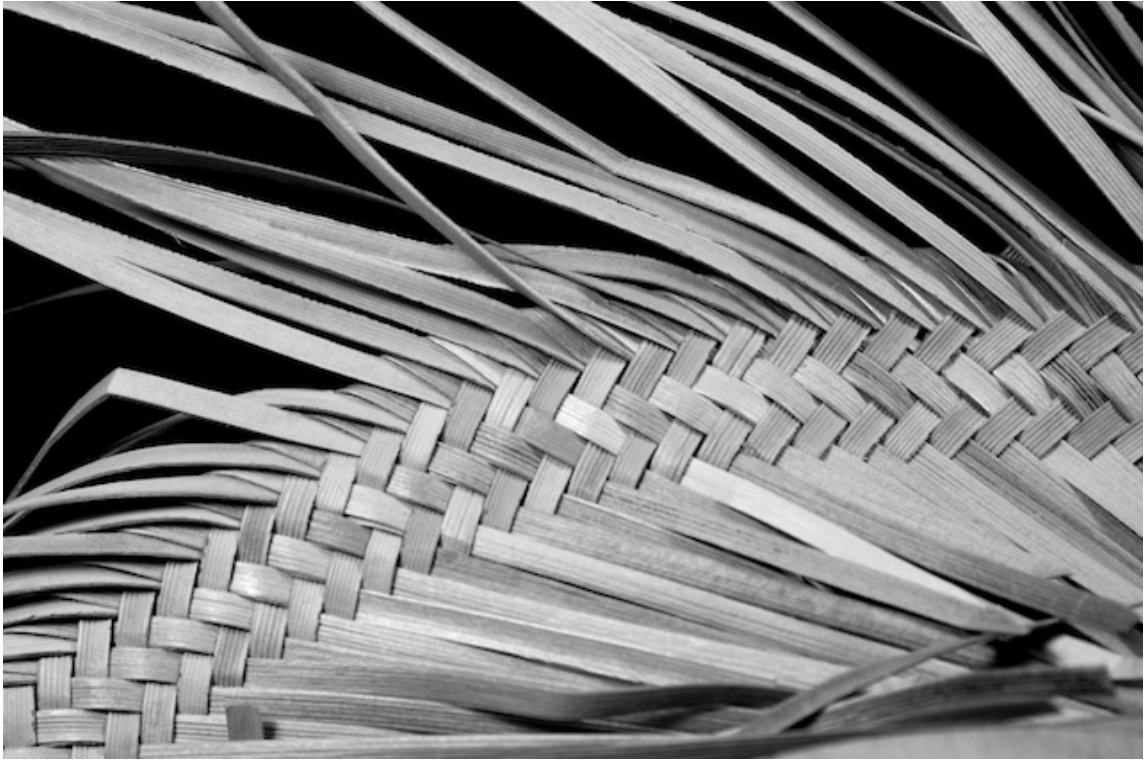
Continue in a like manner. First set of kū.
